MONICA WHITE ENTERS to stage right lectern]

MONICA WHITE: Ladies and gentlemen, and distinguished guests, welcome to the Investiture of the 13th President of the State University of New York at Fredonia. My name is Monica White, Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs and a member of the class of 1994. It is my honor to be presiding over today's ceremony, which will begin as soon as the Fredonia Wind Ensemble has taken its place on stage.

[BAND MEMBERS ENTER from upstage and down stage entrances and Quietly get in place. MONICA TALKS OVER THIS ACTIVITY:]

MONICA WHITE: In keeping with the dignity of this ceremony, we ask you to please turn off your cell phones and that you refrain from texting during the proceedings. As the musicians take their place, I would like to thank Brian Bogey, a member of the Class of 1969 and current instructor of organ in our School of Music, for providing today's organ PRAY-ludes.

[Gesture stage right, Brian enters, bows again, -- applause-- exits.]

MONICA WHITE: The magnificent 2,400-pipe | Schlicker organ, on which Mr. Bogey performed, recently underwent extensive repairs and renovation that took over 12 weeks to complete. On behalf of the entire campus, we extend our sincere appreciation and gratitude to **Jim and alumna Carol Boltz**, a member of the class

of 1981, for making this renovation work possible through a generous gift to the Fredonia College Foundation.

When the Wind Ensemble, under the direction of Dr. Paula Holcomb, plays the processional, we ask that you please remain seated so all may have a good view of those processing. As the processional approaches across the central Plaza of Rockefeller Arts Center and makes its way to the entrance of the hall, they will be welcomed by members of the Fredonia Drumming Ensemble.

[CUE PROCESSIONAL TO BEGIN FROM BARTLETT]

[LONG PAUSE FOR MONICA]

[Drumming outside as processional enters and gets in place at rear left and right of hall]

[PROCESSIONAL HOLDS at house manager's box until music plays.]

[Wait for Paula and Band to be in place. THIS MAY TAKE SEVERAL MINUTES. THE BAND MAY TUNE WHEN THEY ARE IN PLACE.]

[Paula waits for cue from ASM that the processional is in place at rear of hall, enters, and starts processional.]

[President Horvath is last to enter; after she takes her place, music will end APPLAUSE LIKELY – Paula stands by. Eric Wilbon enters and takes his place while the following is said:]
