SUMMER TRANSITION CHECKLIST FOR INCOMING STUDENTS

WHO DID NOT ATTEND JUMP START

In case you missed **JUMP START** this summer, here is a helpful checklist to ensure that you are prepared to attend Fredonia for the Fall 2018 semester. *Please complete these items as soon as possible*!



□ VIEW YOUR COURSE SCHEDULE IN YOUR CONNECTION

The Academic Advising Office creates a preliminary course schedule for each new student. You may view your schedule in Your Connection under the Student tab, within the "Registration" area. You will have the opportunity to make changes to your schedule on Friday, August 24 during Orientation by meeting with an academic advisor during desigated times.

COMPLETE YOUR HOUSING APPLICATION

If you plan to live on campus and have paid a housing deposit, you need to complete the housing application that allows you to rank your living preferences. Log into **Your Connection** using your Fredonia ID# and PIN. Then, select the **Student** tab and then the **My Housing** link to complete! □ CONFIRM YOUR MEAL PLAN IN YOUR MyFSA ACCOUNT

In order to ensure you have a meal plan, you need to log into your MyFSA account using your eServices login credentials to confirm that plan *as soon as possible*. Within your MyFSA, you may also sign up for a FREDdebit (optional) until August 31, and/or a Textpack Pre-Pack (optional) until August 15.

☐ UNDERSTANDING YOUR FINANCIAL AID

All students who have completed a FAFSA and are accepted to Fredonia will receive a Financial Aid Award Letter. This letter outlines the financial assistance available to you at Fredonia. Please follow the instructions on the Award Letter to accept/decline federal work study and student loans. Questions regarding this process can be directed to the Office of Financial Aid at (716) 673-3253.

□ LOG-IN TO YOUR FREDMail ACCOUNT

It is very important to log into your FREDMail account daily to stay up-to-date on critical information while you are a student at Fredonia. You can find your login credentials in **Your Connection under your Personal Information Tab**. You will see your **eServices User ID and Password** under the usernames and passwords area.

□ COMPLETE YOUR HEALTH REQUIREMENTS BY AUGUST 15

All students must send in their Immunization Record to the LoGrasso Health Center prior to August 15, 2018. If you have any questions, please visit fredonia.edu/healthcenter/incomingstudents.asp.

☐ SEND FINAL TRANSCRIPTS, ADVANCED CREDIT & COLLEGE CREDIT COURSEWORK

We must receive official final transcripts showing successful completion of your current studies. You will also want to send any AP, IB, CLEP or college coursework you have completed in High School. CREATE AN AUTHORIZED USER ACCOUNT FOR FOR A PARENT TO PAY THE eBILL

If you (student) would like to create an authorized user account to give access to someone else to pay the eBill, you may do so in Your Connection. Once logged in, select "View eBill," the review the page and accept the terms. Click on the "Authorized User" icon on the right side. Follow the instructions and click on "Continue." Your authorized user will receive an email with their unique link for access and instructions for logging in.

☐ PAY YOUR eBILL

Fredonia does *not* send out paper billing statements; however, students desiring a paper statement can print their own through the TouchNet eBill system. *Your bill will be available to view around July 24 in Your Connection and can be paid through TouchNet*. □ MOVE-IN FOR NEW STUDENTS IS ON AUGUST 23

□ NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION IS AUGUST 24-26

New Student Orienation is three days of workshops, activities, and events to assist new students to prepare to live and learn on campus. There are both optional and mandatory sessions and events throughout the three days. All new students are invited to attend, not just those living on campus. Program components include academic advising, navigating campus, exposure to academic and personal support services, building relationships and networks, and participating in campus traditions.
