EIGHT INDUCTED INTO HONOR SOCIETY

CHI ALPHA EPSILON national honor society was formed to recognize the academic achievement of students admitted to colleges and universities through non-traditional criteria/ opportunity programs. Dr. Elbert M. Saddler, Ph.D., founded Chi Alpha Epsi-





SHAUN NELMS NAMED EDP ALUMNUS AWARD WINNER

Mr. Shaun Nelms was named EDP's Distinguished Alumnus on March 19. Originally from Buffalo, Shaun was awarded Bachelor of Science in Education degrees in History and Secondary

Education/Social Studies from Fredonia in May 1999. He earned his Master of Science in Education in March 2004 from the University of Rochester, Warner School, with a major in Educational Administration and has his New York State permanent certification as a school administrator and supervisor.

Shaun started working as a 7th grade social studies teacher in the Rochester City School district. While there he initiated a "Gentlemen's Club" to help at-risk students with social/behavioral needs. After teaching 8th grade social studies, he moved on to being an assistant principal and is now middle school principal at Burger Middle School in the Rush Henrietta Central School District. Among his duties are supervising over 100 staff members and coordinating school and district events. He has been a presenter at superintendent conferences and NYS middle school conferences.

At Fredonia Shaun shared his variety of talents while being a resident assistant for two years, and he played on the Blue Devil men's basketball team as well as being an assistant varsity coach. Through his athletic and academic success, he gained confidence in his abilities and is able to share what he has learned in his classroom. Shaun now resides in Rochester, New York, with his wife and family.

EDP FRESHMAN SUMMER ORIENTATION

The EDP Freshman Summer Orientation will take place August 21-23, occurring right before the start of the fall semester. Approximately 40-45 new EDP students will arrive on campus to become better acquainted with the EDP staff and participate in some additional activities to prepare them for their college experience. The fee, meal, and lodging costs during the orientation are covered for each student by contributions from Fredonia State and a grant from the Office of Opportunity Programs (OOP) in Albany. OOP is the supervising department over all Educational Opportunity Programs.

New freshmen will also participate in the College's Summer Orientation and Advising Program (SOAP). They will choose from one of five two-day sessions where they will have a chance to select their fall classes and attend presentations on topics such as financial aid, the billing process, and on-campus services. It is **mandatory** that new EDP freshmen attend both a SOAP session and the three-day EDP orientation.
