**Counselor in Residence**: The Counselor in Residence (CIR) offers residence hall students support in accessing the Counseling Center, off campus mental health treatment, and aid in accessing a variety of support on and off campus. Summary of CIR 20-21 AY activities, outreach, programs and support:

- Planned and executed 2 large scales, campus-wide, wellness programming weeks
- Fall- Fresh Check Day (Wellness Week)
- Spring- Week of Hope
- Supervised 4 interns (3 Fredonia BSWs and one MSW)
- Coordinated delivery of over 700 wellness kits to first-year residence halls
- Provided Mental health training to RA's during Fall and Spring Training
- Provided outreach to 40+ students referred to CIR for resources (SOC, RD, faculty referrals)
- Assisted in the coordination of reslife outreach to SOC students.
- Held the first-ever RA Wellness Series and had 22 RAs participate
- Collaborated with community partners- Alliance for Suicide
   Prevention, Dept of Mental Hygiene, Jordan Porco Foundation
- Facilitated the opening of the first-ever FREDwell Lounge in the Williams center
- Coordinated with SA, Life Clubs and other student groups to use the Lounge for wellness-related programming.
- Coordinated with the Food Pantry to host a satellite pantry location in the lounge, the food pantry also supplied a fridge and freezer for the lounge

- Coordinated and supervised the staffing of the lounge with reslife interns.
- Supervised 6 peer-led groups over 12 weeks
- Planned and executed the first-ever FREDfocus with Advising- Tabling event to provide tips, tricks and resources to support students following mid-term grades. 30+ students participated in this event.
- Participated in the planning and execution of reslife pop-up programming

### **Residence Life Student/Staff Selection & Training**

- Resident Assistant Selection Process Spring 2021 for Fall staff.
  - 59 student candidates completed RA application process
  - 21 students hired to replace non-returning RA's.
- RA/RD Training RA/RD Training team planned fall/spring comprehensive training programs for RA/RD staff utilizing both asynchronous and synchronous teaching methods.
  - Topics included: Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, LGBTQ+ Cultural Competency, Microaggressions, Fire Safety, Situations Lab, Daring Leadership, Proactive student engagement, & Putting the "social" in social distancing.
